A JOINT MEMORIAL

SUPPORTING LOS ALAMOS NATIONAL LABORATORY'S SCHOOL-TO-WORK EFFORTS.

WHEREAS, Los Alamos national laboratory, the university of California, the United States department of energy and their business partners have made significant efforts to stimulate economic activity in northern New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, part of that economic activity has resulted in the development of the Los Alamos research park, which will attract high technology businesses to northern New Mexico and generate an increased number of job choices; and

WHEREAS, the state of New Mexico recently allocated seventeen million dollars (\$17,000,000) to promote work force development, which is an essential component of successful economic development measures; and

WHEREAS, Los Alamos national laboratory has been actively conducting educational work force development programs at elementary, secondary and post-secondary levels for many years to help increase student interest in math, science and technology; and

WHEREAS, Los Alamos national laboratory also works directly with regional two-year community colleges to help develop curriculum and to educate faculty in areas of technology useful to the laboratory work force and beneficial to citizens seeking employment with the laboratory; and

WHEREAS, the laboratory also hires over five hundred undergraduate student interns each summer, providing them with experience in the fields of math, science and engineering and many of those students return after graduation to work permanently for the laboratory;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that schools, colleges and nonprofit entities in northern New Mexico that receive work force development funds coordinate their efforts in working with the laboratory and its business partners to assess the types of employment available through the laboratory, the skills necessary for that employment and to continue nurturing interests of students from kindergarten through high school in these jobs and skills; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that regional higher education . 120939.1

institutions in northern New Mexico, particularly northern New Mexico community college, Santa Fe community college and the university of New Mexico at Los Alamos continue to focus their curriculum development on skills and knowledge that will lead directly to employment at the laboratory; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the regional higher education institutions and Los Alamos national laboratory present the efforts of their cooperation and curriculum coordination to the economic development, science and technology committee no later than October 1, 1998; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to the presidents of northern New Mexico community college, Santa Fe community college and the university of New Mexico at Los Alamos, the director of Los Alamos national laboratory, the commission on higher education and the legislative education study committee.
