16	WHEREAS, in early January 1997, the optics support				
17	function of the north range of the Stallion range center of				
18	White Sands missile range was transferred to Holloman air				
19	force base; and				
20	WHEREAS, this transfer resulted in the loss of twenty				
21	jobs from the Socorro area; and				
22	WHEREAS, these employees were offered only the options of				
23	showing up for work at the new location three hours away,				
24	taking early retirement or losing their jobs; and				
25	WHEREAS, it is believed, but as yet is unconfirmed by the				
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employer, that moving this optics support function was not to comply with a scientific need related to performing the work but rather to possibly save money by reducing salary costs of senior and experienced employees, most of whom have between twenty and twenty-five years of experience; and

WHEREAS, knowledgeable financial computations on the matter give no hint of savings simply by moving the unit from the Stallion range center to the Holloman air force base; and WHEREAS, in a community of approximately eight thousand persons, the loss of income from twenty jobs means a very noticeable impact on local revenue, including gross receipts revenue; and

WHEREAS, unemployment in the Socorro area averaged over nine percent for calendar year 1996; and

WHEREAS, the international association of machinists and aerospace workers, the Socorro city council, the Socorro county commission, the greater Socorro area chamber of commerce and the Socorro public school district administration have all strongly protested the transfer of these jobs from the Stallion range center;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico congressional delegation and the governor of New Mexico be requested to use every available means to return these optics support function jobs to the north range of the Stallion range center on a . 122461.1

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the optics support unit is returned to the north range of the Stallion range center, the contractor administrating the work be requested to offer to rehire all employees who separated due to the location shift; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the administration of the White Sands missile range and its various contractors be requested to take into serious consideration the financial impact on local communities as they rearrange their corporate economies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to the international associations of machinists and aerospace workers, the Socorro city council, the Socorro county commission, the greater Socorro area chamber of commerce, the Socorro public school district administration, the commander of the White Sands missile range, the commander of Holloman air force base, each member of New Mexico's congressional delegation and the governor.
