### A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE STATE ENGINEER TO INVOLVE WATER
USERS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF WATER CONSERVATION LEGISLATION FOR
THE CONSIDERATION OF THE FORTY-FOURTH LEGISLATURE.

WHEREAS, water is an essential but finite resource; and WHEREAS, New Mexico is the third driest state and is subject to periodic droughts, which substantially reduce the available water supply; and

WHEREAS, virtually all of New Mexico's renewable water resources are fully appropriated; and

WHEREAS, growth, development and changing public needs are increasing water demands and reducing available supplies; and

WHEREAS, the unauthorized use of water to which another person is entitled or the willful waste of surface or ground

water is unlawful; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico law provides that the state engineer may not approve an application to appropriate water or change the purpose or place of use of an existing appropriation if the application is contrary to the conservation of water within the state; and

WHEREAS, many water right owners perceive that they must use all their existing water rights to protect them against forfeiture, which constitutes a disincentive for conservation; and

WHEREAS, transfer of conserved water to new uses must not increase the total consumptive use of New Mexico's fully appropriated stream systems and ground water aquifers; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico has a major interest in the conservation of water and needs to explore the removal of disincentives for water conservation and the creation of incentives; and

WHEREAS, existing water rights are private property rights that must be protected; and

WHEREAS, water users in New Mexico have widely varying perspectives and concerns regarding water conservation; and

WHEREAS, numerous water conservation approaches and concepts, some of which overlap, some of which are in conflict and some of which would increase consumptive water use to the injury of existing water right owners and the state, have been

submitted as legislative bills for the consideration of the legislature; and

WHEREAS, the state engineer has drafted water conservation legislation that would affect New Mexico water users; and

WHEREAS, the state engineer has announced that his office will conduct discussions over the next year with New Mexico water users to see that their perspectives and concerns regarding water conservation are given full consideration for possible inclusion in water conservation legislation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the office of the state engineer form an advisory committee representing the diverse water uses and perspectives regarding water conservation in New Mexico to develop water conservation legislation, giving full consideration to the recommendations of the advisory committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the office of the state engineer prepare a single consolidated conservation bill, rather than numerous and overlapping or conflicting or technically harmful bills, and present the bill by August 1998 to the appropriate legislative interim committee with jurisdiction over water issues; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the state engineer.
