A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING A STUDY OF INCREASING AVAILABILITY OF EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE FROM CERTAIN EMPLOYERS.

WHEREAS, New Mexico, sadly, is a national leader among states with high percentages of individuals and families living without health insurance, even though most uninsured adults are employed; and

WHEREAS, more than fifty-six percent of uninsured New Mexico families have a single full-time wage earner, and an additional fourteen percent of our uninsured families have two full-time wage earners; and

WHEREAS, only slightly more than fifty percent of New Mexico employers offer health insurance, though their number includes ninety-four percent of the employers of more than fifty employees; and

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WHEREAS, the legislature has enacted the Health Insurance Alliance Act to assist our small businesses to offer reasonable health insurance coverage to their employees; and

WHEREAS, approximately one thousand New Mexico businesses participate in the alliance to offer their employees health insurance; and

WHEREAS, various New Mexico tax savings, subsidies and training efforts are well designed to encourage creation of permanent jobs in our state, but not all of the employers benefiting from these programs offer their employees health insurance; and

WHEREAS, the state needs to encourage all employers to follow the example of the most far-sighted businesses that offer employee health insurance as a matter of course to obtain and retain high quality employees; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico taxpayers, either through medicaid or the various county indigent funds, ultimately pick up the bill for delivery of health care to the uninsured; and

WHEREAS, it behooves the state of New Mexico, in the name of all of its citizens, to establish the highest standards for those businesses it chooses to assist, including reasonable employee benefits and employee health insurance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy commission study the possibilities and advisability of

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requiring all businesses receiving various benefits, directly and indirectly, from the state or participating in state programs having the effect of subsidizing any part of their operation to offer their employees access to reasonable and adequate health insurance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the secretaries of economic

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the secretaries of economic development and human services and the superintendent of insurance, or their designees, cooperate in this study; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico health policy commission seek participation from statewide insurance organizations, including those that assist small businesses to obtain health insurance for their employees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the chairman of the New Mexico health policy commission for appropriate distribution.

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
