A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT ALL COUNTIES PROVIDE RESIDENTS THE OPTION TO DECLINE COUNTY WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES.

WHEREAS, as a consequence of inadequate revenues to operate expensive solid waste facilities that comply with environmental protection agency requirements, many counties have had to consolidate landfill and other solid waste facilities; and

WHEREAS, closure of landfills and the attendant increase in distances traveled and costs incurred by residents for waste disposal have increased litter and illegal dumping throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, many counties are trying to cope with the litter and illegal dumping problem by establishing publicly financed curbside waste collection services to be paid for from service

charges on all residents in their jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, because New Mexico is one of the poorest states, with a per capita income ranking of about forty-seventh in the nation, making public services such as curbside waste collection mandatory is unfair to low-income residents; and

WHEREAS, many subdivisions, neighborhoods and community associations contract with private waste collection services, and mandatory public waste collection charges to residents of these areas is unfair because they would be paying double for services already provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that all counties that establish mandatory services, such as curbside trash collection, be requested to provide residents the option not to participate in trash collection services so that low-income residents are not unfairly taxed and residents already paying for services are not unfairly treated; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to all boards of county commissioners.
