## A J OI NT MEMORI AL

REQUESTI NG THE STATE PARK AND RECREATI ON DI VI SI ON OF THE ENERGY, M NERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT TO CONTI NUE ITS MANAGEMENT AND OPERATI ON OF THE CORONADO STATE PARK.

WHEREAS, Coronado state park is managed sol el y by the state park and recreation di vision of the energy, minerals and nat ural resources department and Coronado state monument is managed by the museum di vision of the office of cultural affairs; and

WHEREAS, the state park and recreation di vision has proposed that the management of both facilities be the sole responsi bility of the museum di vision; and

WHEREAS, $t$ he director of $t$ he state park and recreation di vi si on summarily informed the di rector of the museum di vision in April 1997 that the facility would be transferred
to the museum di visi on in November of that year with certain park facilities closed or removed fromthe property; and WHEREAS, the di rect or of the museum di vi si on has stated that his di vision is not able to support the decision to close the park or to transfer management of the facility because the di vi si on lacks the personnel, equi pment and operating budget; and

WHEREAS, a draft j oi nt powers agreement was submitted to the museum di vi si on in October 1997; and

WHEREAS, the park is a popul ar facility and provides economic benefit to Sandoval county and the town of Bernalillo and many park visitors and community leaders oppose the cl osure or transfer of the park; and

WHEREAS, the attorney general's office has obj ected to the park's closure or transfer based on terns of a lease still in effect until the year 2042, the management authority pursuant to the enabling stat utes of the respective agencies, the I ack of I egi slative authorization for transference of appropriations and the I ack of legi slative authority for transference of property pursuant to Chapter 13, Article 6 NMSA 1978 or personnel pursuant to Section 10-7-1 NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, the state park and recreation di vi si on had asserted that the park no longer meets the di vision's criteria for a state park, and yet the state park and recreation . 123285. 2
di vision has not explained its criteria to the public; and WHEREAS, the state park and recreation di vi si on should conduct publ ic hearings on any proposed closure or transfer of a state park in the future; and

WHEREAS, private busi nesses and, theref ore, the I ocal economy may be hurt by the closure or improper and inadequate transfer of resources and operations of a state park as i mortant and popul ar as Coronado state park; and

WHEREAS, transfer or cl osure of the park may jeopardize the safety and security of the commity and visitors to the area; and

WHEREAS, $t$ his situation clearly supports the need for the I egi sl at ure to re-establish a state park commi ssion;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO that Coronado state park continue to be managed and operated by the state park and recreation di vision of the energy, minerals and nat ural resources department pursuant to stat utory authority and I egi slative appropriations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any further di scussions or pl ans for changing the operating conditions of the park be conducted and prepared forthrightly, properly and pursuant to I aw, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the governor, the secretary of energy, minerals . 123285. 2
