19	WHEREAS, in 1988, the institute of American Indian arts								
20	became an independent, federally chartered, nonprofit

22	WHEREAS, the state of New Mexico recognizes that having								
23	the institute of American Indian arts located in Santa Fe is								
24	beneficial to the state, to the Native American population of								
25	the state and to the art community in New Mexico; and

1 WHEREAS, the institute is unique to the western 2 hemisphere, having drawn students from nearly all of the five 3 hundred forty-seven recognized Indian tribes in the country 4 during its thirty-six years of teaching; and 5 WHEREAS, this is the most critical period of the institute's history, since it has suffered a forty-seven 6 7 percent budget cut in federal support over the past three years; and 8 9 WHEREAS, from its earliest days, Santa Fe has been a hub 10 of commercial activity centered around the Native American 11 population; and 12 WHEREAS, today many artists who participate in the Santa 13 Fe Indian art community are graduates of the institute of 14 American Indian Arts contributing substantially to Santa Fe's 15 status as the second largest arts market in the country; and 16 WHEREAS, the economic importance of Indian art in Santa 17 Fe is expressed by the negative outcry raised each time there 18 is mention of moving the Indian market from the immediate 19 Santa Fe area; and 20 WHEREAS, due to its federally chartered status, the 21 institute of American Indian arts is seeking appropriations 22 from congress to continue the school's annual operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico congressional delegation and the president of the United States be requested . 120263.3
