22	problems, and massage therapy is cost effective in treatment
23	of acute soft tissue injuries and highly effective in treating
24	premature infants; and
25	WHEREAS, soft tissue therapies stimulate the body's own

WHEREAS, chronic back pain and carpal tunnel syndrome cause high medical expenses, lost time and low productivity in the workplace and are immediately mitigated by massage therapy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the legislative health and human services committee together with the board of massage therapy establish a task force to assess the impact of mandating health insurance coverage for massage therapy, including the fiscal impact on the cost of health insurance coverage as well as the quality of care for the patient; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed of ten members to include a massage therapist with a neuromuscular or sports massage therapy background, an orthopedic surgeon, a rehabilitation specialist, a chiropractor, a doctor of oriental medicine, a physical therapist, two consumers, a health insurance representative and a business professional; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its findings and recommendations to the legislative health and human services committee by November 1, 1998; and
