legislature declared the third Monday in January as an official state holiday honoring Martin Luther King, Jr. to remind us that the struggle for freedom and equality is neverending; and

WHEREAS, in Laws 1991, Chapter 252, the New Mexico legislature again recognized the importance of continuing the work of this dedicated leader by establishing the state Martin Luther King, Jr. commission, now officed in Albuquerque; and WHEREAS, the city of Albuquerque, in 1995, renamed a main downtown thoroughfare, the old Grand avenue, as Martin Luther King, Jr. boulevard; and

WHEREAS, a recent survey clearly indicates that approximately half the state's eighty-nine school districts, nine of our seventeen public institutions of higher education and some of our county governments do not observe Martin Luther King, Jr. day to remind us that unity and understanding serve our country and our state better than hatred and racism; and

WHEREAS, president Bill Clinton signed the King Holiday and Service Act of 1994, expanding the mission of the federal Martin Luther King, Jr. federal holiday commission to include promotion of this important holiday to encourage its observation by community service, interracial cooperation and youth anti-violence initiatives;
