A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO CREATE AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE IMPACTS OF SUBDIVISIONS AND SUBDIVISION LAWS.

WHEREAS, the 1995 New Mexico legislature substantially rewrote the New Mexico Subdivision Act, to be effective July 1, 1996; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Subdivision Act now requires each county to enact regulations governing subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, the counties have exercised the right to regulate subdivisions in very different ways; and

WHEREAS, the effect of the new law and the county regulations implementing the law on growth and development within New Mexico has not been assessed; and

aware of any problems caused or associated with the new law and the positive or negative impacts caused by the law and by subdivisions in New Mexico;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico
legislative council be requested to create a legislative
interim committee to:

- A. examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, regulations and court decisions governing subdivisions in New Mexico:
- B. gather testimony and other information on the effects of the New Mexico Subdivision Act and county regulations implementing that act;
- C. gather testimony and other information on the positive and negative effects associated with subdivisions; and
- D. recommend legislation or changes, if any are found to be necessary, to the first session of the forty-fourth legislature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to each member of the New Mexico legislative council.
