A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO LEAD A STUDY OF THE

NEEDS FOR AND BEST METHODS OF PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE STATEWIDE

MENTAL HEALTH IN THE SCHOOLS PROGRAM

WHEREAS, New Mexico wants to support the academic needs and educational success of our children; and

WHEREAS, school children face multiple barriers to successful learning, including biological learning problems, personal and family issues, a lack of coordinated and accessible school and community assessment resources and service programs and a lack of teacher training and resources; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico ranks in the top fifteen states in the rates of alcoholism, public school dropouts, domestic violence, poverty and violent teen death; and

WHEREAS, children in our schools have need of multiple mental health resources, as documented by both state and national data showing that more than one-third of all children seen in school-based health centers have primary mental health needs; and

WHEREAS, students require an integrated continuum of services, but children's outpatient mental health services in New Mexico are scarce, lacking in coordination and difficult to access; and

WHEREAS, over fifty percent of all children detained in the juvenile justice system meet criteria for at least one mental health diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, schools have clear responsibility to evaluate students with behavioral health needs for disabilities and to provide appropriate services; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of medical d managed care requires that schools take a more pivotal role, collaborating with community providers to ensure quality behavioral health services: and

WHEREAS, students face daily multiple life stresses, have multiple mental health needs and require coordinated services to break down barriers to learning in order to achieve success in education:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE . 120173. 1

STATE OF NEW MEXICO that a task force be formed to study programs and needs relevant to school mental health throughout New Mexico and to propose solutions to these needs and options to improve existing programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the office of school health in the public health division of the department of health be designated as the lead agency to organize the task force and conduct the study; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force include representatives from the department of health, the state department of public education, the children, youth and families department, the human services department, the corrections department, the administrative office of the courts, the children's subcommittee of the governor's mental health planning council, the developmental disabilities planning council, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act council and a wide range of consumers, advocates and providers working in the mental health field and other appropriate individuals and groups concerned about children's mental health, including school personnel; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force's recommendations include clarification of the responsibilities and authority of each agency for providing programs and assessment of and recommendations on information collected by the agencies that may be helpful in improving school mental

health programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force study financial resources from all governmental sources that contribute to school mental health programs and whether these resources can be used more efficiently in delivering the needed programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include examination and specific recommendations for both intra-agency and interagency cooperation to ensure maximum cooperation in providing school mental health programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include an examination of and recommendations on increased training for all school personnel, including teachers, counselors, nurses, social workers, psychologists and others, as their work relates to improving school mental health; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its findings and recommendations by October 30, 1998 to the interim legislative health and human services committee and the legislative education study committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the director of the office of school health of the public health division of the department of health for distribution to all appropriate parties.
