17	WHEREAS, oral health care is an integral component of						
18	primary health care; and						
19	WHEREAS, the prevalence of oral disease is universal and						
20	negatively impacts the overall health status of New Mexicans;						
21	and						
22	WHEREAS, access to oral health care services should be						
23	available to all New Mexicans; and						
24	WHEREAS, the number and distribution of oral health care						
25	providers and facilities are essential to ensure access; and						
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WHEREAS, perceived barriers to access to oral health care services for New Mexicans exist; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive assessment of the primary oral health care delivery system has never been performed and is essential to determine access barriers and establish opportunities for equitable access to oral health care for New Mexicans;

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
9 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy
10 commission conduct a comprehensive assessment of access to
11 oral health care services in New Mexico and make
12 recommendations regarding issues of access to oral health care
13 services, including the following:

A. the adequacy of the supply, capacity and distribution of oral health care services, providers and facilities;

B. access standards for oral health care services for
 New Mexico;

C. the adequacy of educational and training programs to meet New Mexico's needs for oral health care;

D. existing resources to improve the supply and distribution of oral health care providers and services;

E. current publicly funded programs to enhance access to oral health care services and determine their efficiency and effectiveness;

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F. barriers, including adequacy of privately and . 121896.1

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publicly funded reimbursement, to accessing oral health care services and evaluation of the effectiveness of existing publicly funded initiatives;

G. the options used nationally and by other states to improve access to oral health care services and assess their applicability to New Mexico;

H. perceived barriers to retention of health care
 providers, especially in rural areas, and development of
 specific strategies to remove barriers;

I. publicly funded incentives to provide oral health care services in underserved areas of the state and to other underserved populations; and

J. options, based on findings, and recommendations to cost-effectively improve access to oral health care services. These recommendations should address the supply and distribution of oral health care providers in the state and the use of existing resources and initiatives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an interim report of recommendations developed as a result of the efforts by the New Mexico health policy commission be presented to the appropriate interim legislative committee by May 15, 1999 and a final report be presented to the appropriate interim legislative committee by October 1, 1999; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the chairman of the New Mexico health policy .121896.1
