A JOINT MEMORIAL

SUPPORTING A PLANNING PROCESS TO DEVELOP REVISIONS TO THE HOME-BASED RESIDENTIAL MODEL OF THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES WAIVER.

WHEREAS, residential services provided to persons with developmental disabilities by family members and surrogate family members are cost effective; and

WHEREAS, clients living in the homes of residential service providers have been shown to receive excellent, one-on-one care in the least restrictive setting; and

WHEREAS, clients living in home environments experience optimum behavior and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, allowing family members to provide services helps keep families of persons with developmental disabilities intact, and the care of surrogate family members helps create

a supportive, family-like environment; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of home-based living is one of the recommendations of a state audit for complying with the Jackson lawsuit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that home-based living services for persons with developmental disabilities be encouraged and supported by the department of health in its current and future policy and rate-making decisions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health initiate an ongoing planning process to analyze, study, review and develop revisions to the home-based residential model of the developmental disabilities waiver; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the planning process consist of twelve participants, including representatives from the department of health, the human services department, the New Mexico association of family providers and provider agencies, and that the participants be chosen by a consensus of the department of health and the New Mexico association of family providers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the results of the study and suggestions for changes to the home-based residential model of the developmental disabilities waiver be presented to the interim legislative health and human services committee no later than October 1, 1998; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health be requested to maintain its funding to home-based providers and maintain current regulations until the planning process has been completed and presented to the interim legislative health and human services committee so that home-based living services will continue to encourage willing and qualified family members, surrogate family members and guardians of persons with developmental disabilities to provide services in the home-based residential model; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to the secretary of health, the secretary of human services, the governor and the New Mexico association of family providers.
