A MEMORIAL

RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ADOLESCENT SOCIAL ACTION PROGRAM AND URGING THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO TO INCORPORATE THE PROGRAM INTO THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO SCHOOL OF MEDICINE.

WHEREAS, the adolescent social action program is a collaborative, primary prevention program developed in Albuquerque whose goals are to reduce mortality and morbidity among adolescents and empower young people to be change agents in their communities; and

WHEREAS, the adolescent social action program was formed in 1982 as the alcohol substance abuse prevention program in the school of medicine's department of family, community and emergency medicine at the university of New Mexico and has since evolved into a program with multiple affiliations that

1 provides a unique link between the community and the  
2 university; and

3 WHEREAS, more than three thousand children and families  
4 throughout New Mexico have received adolescent social action  
5 program primary prevention services, which include encouraging  
6 at-risk adolescents to explore drug-free options and  
7 encouraging youth to work to implement social change; and

8 WHEREAS, over the years, community services have included  
9 research, technical and teacher training and youth social  
10 action projects such as fotonovellas, community murals,  
11 involvement in campaigns against tobacco advertising,  
12 involvement in campaigns against the use of alcohol at the  
13 state fair, gang prevention task forces and presentations at  
14 local and national conferences; and

15 WHEREAS, the adolescent social action program has  
16 provided training, practicum experience and education to over  
17 four hundred university students who act as facilitators with  
18 small groups of youth; and

19 WHEREAS, programs such as the adolescent social action  
20 program should be encouraged to continue working for the  
21 betterment of society;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE  
23 OF NEW MEXICO that appreciation and encouragement be expressed  
24 to the staff of the adolescent social action program for its  
25 work in helping youth from at-risk communities and its role in
