AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL RETIREMENT; AMENDING THE EDUCATIONAL RETIREMENT ACT TO ALLOW PROVISIONAL MEMBERS TO ACQUIRE EARNED SERVICE CREDIT FOR CERTAIN PERIODS OF EMPLOYMENT; ALLOWING THE PURCHASE OF EXEMPTED SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-11-17 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 141, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-11-17. PROVISIONAL MEMBERSHIP. --

A. A provisional member shall be covered by the provisions of the Educational Retirement Act but shall have the option to exempt himself from its coverage. A provisional member exempting himself from the provisions of the Educational Retirement Act shall not be entitled to the benefits or coverage under any other state retirement program

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1 except as otherwise provided in this section. This section
2 shall not affect any rights a provisional member may have
3 ~~[under]~~ pursuant to the provisions of the federal Social
4 Security Act. This option to exempt must be exercised within
5 one year of employment according to the ~~[regulations]~~ rules
6 adopted by the board. Any provisional member exempting
7 himself pursuant to this section shall be entitled to a refund
8 of any contributions made pursuant to the Educational
9 Retirement Act prior to the exercise of the exemption.

10 B. A provisional member not exempt from the
11 coverage of the Educational Retirement Act shall have the
12 right to earned service-credit for periods of employment
13 subsequent to July 1, 1957 and prior to July 1, 1961; provided
14 that all contributions at the rates in effect during that
15 period of employment are paid. If a provisional member
16 chooses to make the contributions for that period, the local
17 administrative unit employing a member during that period
18 shall pay the employer's contribution at the rate in effect
19 during that period of employment. Contributions prior to July
20 1, 1961 by both the provisional member and the local
21 administrative unit shall bear interest at the rate of three
22 percent a year from July 1, 1961 until paid.

23 C. A provisional member exempt from the coverage
24 of the provisions of the Educational Retirement Act shall have
25 the right to revoke the exemption at any time; however, within

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1 the first two weeks following the beginning of each school
2 year, such provisional member shall be informed by the local
3 administrative unit in writing of his right to revoke the
4 exemption and shall sign a statement to the effect that he
5 does or does not wish to revoke the exemption. A copy of such
6 statement shall be kept in the personnel file of the
7 provisional member. Any provisional member who revokes his
8 exemption from coverage shall have the right to acquire earned
9 service-credit for periods of employment during which the
10 exemption or exemptions were in force, under the following
11 conditions:

12 (1) both the member and the administrative
13 unit contributions, at the rate in effect during the periods
14 of employment and applied to the earnings of the member during
15 such periods, shall be paid to the fund, together with
16 interest, at a rate equal to the actuarial assumption rate by
17 the board;

18 (2) member and administrative unit
19 contributions, together with interest, may both be paid by the
20 member; or

21 (3) if the member tenders payment of his
22 contributions, together with interest, the local
23 administrative unit by whom he was employed may, but shall not
24 be obligated to, pay the administrative unit contributions,
25 together with interest; and

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1 (4) the right of a member to acquire earned
2 service credit in accordance with this subsection shall expire
3 on June 30, 2002.

4 D. A provisional member employed by the board, the
5 department of education, the New Mexico school for the deaf,
6 the northern New Mexico state school, the New Mexico school
7 for the visually handicapped, the New Mexico girls' school,
8 the New Mexico boys' school or the Los Lunas mental hospital
9 shall have the option of qualifying for coverage under either
10 the Educational Retirement Act or the public employees
11 retirement association of New Mexico. This option shall be
12 exercised by filing a written election with both the
13 educational retirement director and the [~~director~~] executive
14 secretary of the public employees retirement association of
15 New Mexico. This election shall be made within six months
16 after employment and shall be irrevocable regardless of
17 subsequent employment or reemployment in any administrative
18 unit enumerated in this subsection. Until this election is
19 made, the provisional member shall be covered and shall be
20 required to make contributions under the Educational
21 Retirement Act. "

22 Section 2. Section 22-11-21.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
23 1998, Chapter 38, Section 1) is amended to read:

24 "22-11-21.3. PICK UP--ROLLOVER. --

25 A. Commencing on July 1, 1998, each local

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1 administrative unit may, solely for the purpose of compliance
2 with Section 414(h) of the Internal Revenue Code, pick up, for
3 the purposes specified in that section, member contributions
4 permitted by Paragraph (4) of Subsection A of Section 22-11-34
5 NMSA 1978; Subsection C of Section 22-11-33 NMSA 1978; and
6 Subsection C of Section 22-11-17 NMSA 1978. Member
7 contributions picked up under the provisions of this
8 subsection shall be treated as local administrative unit
9 contributions for purposes of determining income tax
10 obligations under the Internal Revenue Code; however, such
11 picked-up member contributions shall be included in the
12 determination of the member's gross annual salary for all
13 other purposes under federal and state laws. Member
14 contributions picked up under this section shall continue to
15 be designated member contributions for all purposes of the
16 Educational Retirement Act and shall be considered as part of
17 the member's annual salary for purposes of determining the
18 amount of the member's contribution. The provisions of this
19 section are voluntary, and the member shall have no option
20 concerning the pick up to receive the contributed amounts
21 directly instead of having them paid by the local
22 administrative unit to the fund. The contribution may be paid
23 through the administrative unit's payroll deduction.

24 B. Commencing July 1, 1998, the [educational-
25 retirement] board may accept rollover contributions from other

1 retirement funds solely for and subject to the restrictions
2 set forth in Subsection B of Section 22-11-34 NMSA 1978,
3 Section 22-11-17 NMSA 1978 and applicable restrictions set
4 forth in the Internal Revenue Code for pension plan
5 qualification. "
