AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL RETIREMENT; PROVIDING CERTAIN MEMBERS AN OPTION TO RECEIVE A RETIREMENT BENEFIT PLUS A PAYMENT EQUAL TO THE EMPLOYEE AND EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS THAT ARE MADE AFTER THE ELECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-11-30 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 153, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-11-30. RETIREMENT BENEFITS. - -

A. Retirement benefits for a member retired pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or before June 30, 1967 shall be paid monthly and shall be one-twelfth of a sum equal to one and one-half percent of the first four thousand dollars (\$4,000) of the member's average annual salary and one percent of the remainder of the member's

1 average annual salary multiplied by the number of years of the
2 member's total service credit.

3 B. Retirement benefits for a member retired
4 pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or after July 1,
5 1967 but on or before June 30, 1971 shall be paid monthly and
6 shall be one-twelfth of a sum equal to one and one-half
7 percent of the first six thousand six hundred dollars (\$6,600)
8 of the member's average annual salary and one percent of the
9 remainder of the member's average annual salary multiplied by
10 the number of years of the member's total service credit.

11 C. Retirement benefits for a member retired
12 pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or after July 1,
13 1971 but on or before June 30, 1974 shall be paid monthly and
14 shall be one-twelfth of a sum equal to one and one-half
15 percent of the member's average annual salary multiplied by
16 the number of years of the member's total service credit.

17 D. Retirement benefits for a member retired
18 pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or before June
19 30, 1974 but returning to employment on or after July 1, 1974
20 for a cumulation of one or more years shall be computed
21 pursuant to Subsection E of this section. Retirement benefits
22 for a member retired pursuant to the Educational Retirement
23 Act on or before June 30, 1974 but returning to employment on
24 or after July 1, 1974 for a cumulation of less than one year
25 shall be computed pursuant to Subsection A of this section if

1 his date of last retirement was on or before June 30, 1967 or
2 pursuant to Subsection B of this section if his date of last
3 retirement was on or after July 1, 1967 but not later than
4 June 30, 1971 or pursuant to Subsection C of this section if
5 his date of last retirement was on or after July 1, 1971 but
6 not later than June 30, 1974.

7 E. Retirement benefits for a member age sixty or
8 over, retired pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or
9 after July 1, 1974 but not later than June 30, 1987, shall be
10 paid monthly and shall be one-twelfth of a sum equal to:

11 (1) one and one-half percent of the member's
12 average annual salary multiplied by the number of years of
13 service credit for:

- 14 (a) prior employment; and
- 15 (b) allowed service credit for service
16 performed prior to July 1, 1957, except United States military
17 service credit purchased pursuant to Paragraph (3) of
18 Subsection A of Section 22-11-34 NMSA 1978; plus

19 (2) two percent of the member's average
20 annual salary multiplied by the number of years of service
21 credit for:

- 22 (a) contributory employment;
- 23 (b) allowed service credit for service
24 performed after July 1, 1957; and
- 25 (c) United States military service

1 credit for service performed prior to July 1, 1957 and
2 purchased pursuant to Paragraph (3) of Subsection A of Section
3 22-11-34 NMSA 1978.

4 F. Retirement benefits for a member age sixty or
5 over, retired pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or
6 after July 1, 1987 but not later than June 30, 1991, shall be
7 paid monthly and shall be one-twelfth of a sum equal to two
8 and fifteen hundredths percent of the member's average annual
9 salary multiplied by the number of years of the member's total
10 service credit; provided that this subsection shall not apply
11 to any member who was retired in any of the four quarters
12 ending on June 30, 1987 without having accumulated not less
13 than 1.0 years earned service after June 30, 1987.

14 G. Except as provided in Subsection H of this
15 section, retirement benefits for a member age sixty or over,
16 retired pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act on or after
17 July 1, 1991, shall be paid monthly and shall be one-twelfth
18 of a sum equal to two and thirty-five hundredths percent of
19 the member's average annual salary multiplied by the number of
20 years of the member's total service credit; provided that this
21 subsection shall not apply to any member who was retired in
22 any of the four consecutive quarters ending on June 30, 1991
23 without having accumulated at least one year earned service
24 beginning on or after July 1, 1991.

25 H. A member who, at the time of the election, is

1 eligible to retire pursuant to Paragraph (3) of Subsection A
2 of Section 22-11-23 NMSA 1978 but has not retired, may make an
3 irrevocable election with the director to continue regular
4 employment and receive retirement benefits pursuant to this
5 subsection. Upon the later retirement of a member making an
6 election pursuant to this subsection, the member shall
7 receive:

8 (1) a retirement benefit calculated pursuant
9 to Subsection G of this section using the salary at the time
10 of the election and the number of years of the member's total
11 service credit that the member had accumulated at the time of
12 the election; and

13 (2) a lump-sum payment equal to the total of
14 the member's contributions and the contributions of the local
15 administrative unit that were made after the date of the
16 election plus interest at a rate equal to seventy-five percent
17 of the average rate earned by the fund during the five fiscal
18 years preceding the fiscal year of the refund, reduced by the
19 sum of any disability benefits received by the member after
20 the date of the election.

21 [~~H.-~~] I. A member's average annual salary, pursuant
22 to this section, shall be computed on the basis of the last
23 five years for which contribution was made or upon the basis
24 of any consecutive five years for which contribution was made
25 by the member, whichever is higher. Members shall begin
