14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. Section 27-2B-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998,
16	Chapter 8, Section 4 and Laws 1998, Chapter 9, Section 4) is
17	amended to read:

20	REVIEW PERIODS
21	A. Application for cash assistance or services
22	shall be made to the department's county office in the county
23	or district in which an applicant resides. The application
24	shall be in writing or reduced to writing in the manner and on
25	the form prescribed by the department. The application shall
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be made under oath by an applicant having custody of a dependent child and shall contain a statement of the age of the child, residence, a complete statement of the amount of property in which the applicant has an interest, a statement of all income that he and other household group members have at the time of the filing of the application and other information required by the department.

B. Application for expedited food stamps shall be made to the department's county office in the county or district in which an applicant resides. The department shall process the application for expedited food stamps within twenty-four hours after the application is made.

C. At the time of application for cash assistance and services, an applicant shall identify household group members who are to be counted in the benefit group. Once an application is approved, the participant shall advise the department if there are any changes in the membership of the household group or benefit group.

D. No later than forty-five days after an application is filed, the department shall provide to an applicant a resource planning session to ascertain his immediate needs, assess financial and nonfinancial options, make referrals and act on the application.

[E. No later than five days after an application is approved, the department shall provide reimbursement for . 124739.1

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2 <u>E. Immediately after an application is approved,</u>
3 <u>the children, youth and families department shall provide</u>
4 <u>child-care services to the participant.</u>

F. Whenever the department receives an application for assistance, a verification and record of the applicant's circumstances shall promptly be made to ascertain the facts supporting the application and to obtain other information required by the department. The verification may include a visit to the home of the applicant, as long as the department gives adequate prior notice of the visit to the applicant.

G. Within fifteen days after an application is approved, the department shall assess the education, skills, prior work experience and employability of the participant.

H. After the initial assessment of skills, the department shall work with the participant to develop an individual responsibility plan that:

(1) sets forth an employment goal for the participant and a plan for moving the participant into employment;

(2) sets forth obligations of the participant that may include a requirement that the participant attend school, maintain certain grades and attendance, keep his school-age children in school, immunize his children or engage in other activities that will help the participant become and . 124739.1

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2	(3) is designed to the greatest extent
3	possible to move the participant into whatever employment the
4	participant is capable of handling and to provide additional
5	services as necessary to increase the responsibility and
6	amount of work the participant will handle over time;
7	(4) describes the services the department may
8	provide so that the participant may obtain and keep
9	employment; and
10	(5) may require the participant to undergo
11	appropriate substance abuse treatment.
12	I. The participant and a representative of the
13	department shall sign the participant's individual
14	responsibility plan.
15	J. The participant shall also sign a participation
16	agreement that designates the number of hours that he must
17	participate in work activities to meet participation
18	standards.
19	K. The department shall review the current
20	financial eligibility of a benefit group when the department
21	reviews food stamp eligibility.
22	L. The department shall meet semi-annually with a
23	participant to review and revise his individual responsibility
24	pl an.
25	M. The department shall develop a complaint
