15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:						
16	Section 1. Section 22-24-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975,						
17	Chapter 235, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:						
18	"22-24-5. FUNDDI STRI BUTI ON						
19	A. The council shall approve an application for						
20	grant assistance from the fund when the council determines						
21	that:						
22	(1) a critical need exists requiring action;						
23	(2) the residents of the school district have						
24	provided available resources to the <u>school</u> district to meet						
25	its capital outlay requirements;						
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1 (3) the school district has used its 2 resources in a prudent manner; the <u>school</u> district is in a county or 3 (4) counties [which] that have participated in a reappraisal 4 5 program and the reappraised values are on the tax rolls or will be used for the tax year 1979 as certified by the 6 7 property tax division of the taxation and revenue department; 8 (5) the school district has provided 9 insurance for buildings of the school district in accordance 10 with the provisions of Section 13-5-3 NMSA 1978; and 11 [(6) the school district is indebted at not 12 less than seventy-five percent of the total debt authorized by 13 law: and (7)] (6) the school district has submitted a 14 five-year facilities plan that includes enrollment 15 16 projections. 17 **B**. The council shall consider all applications for 18 assistance from the fund and, after a public hearing, shall 19 either approve or deny the application. Applications for 20 grant assistance shall only be accepted by the council after a district has complied with the provisions of this section. 21 22 The council shall list all applications in order of priority, 23 and all allocations shall be made on a priority basis 24 provided, however, except in the case of an emergency, that 25 the order of priority shall first reflect those projects which

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1	have been previously funded but are not as yet completed,					
2	excluding expansion of those projects and contingent upon					
3	maintenance of the required local support]. Projects approved					
4	and ranked by the council shall be funded in accordance with					
5	<u>the following formula:</u>					
6	<u>(district assessed valuation per MEM divided by the state</u>					
7	average assessed valuation per MEM) multiplied by .5.					
8	The product is subtracted from 1.0 and multiplied by.9.					
9	The sum of that calculation added to (percent of bonding					
10	<u>capacity used <math>\div</math> 75%) x .1 = percentage of approved</u>					
11	projects to be funded from the public school capital					
12	outlay fund. "MEM" is the total enrollment of students					
13	attending public school in a school district on a					
14	specified day, with kindergarten being counted as .5. In					
15	those instances in which the formula provides less than					
16	<u>.1, .1 shall be used as the state's share.</u>					
17	C. In those instances in which a school district					
18	has used all of its local resources, the state may fund the					
19	total amount of its projects.					
20	$[\mathbf{C}.]$ <u>D.</u> Money in the fund shall be disbursed by					
21	warrant of the department of finance and administration on					
22	vouchers signed by the secretary of finance and administration					
23	following certification by the council that the application					
24	has been approved. "
