16	Section 1. Section 27-2B-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998,
17	Chapter 8, Section 5 and Laws 1998, Chapter 9, Section 5) is
18	amended to read:
19	"27-2B-5. WORK REQUIREMENTSWORK PARTICIPATION RATES
20	A. The following qualify as work activities:
21	(1) unsubsidized employment;
22	(2) subsidized private sector employment;
23	(3) subsidized public sector employment;
24	(4) work experience, including work
25	associated with the refurbishing of publicly assisted housing
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1 if sufficient private sector employment is not available; 2 (5) on-the-job training; job search and job readiness assistance, 3 (6) 4 as long as the department complies with the federal act; 5 (7) community service programs; vocational education, except that 6 (8) 7 vocational education shall not qualify as a work activity for longer than is provided by the federal act; 8 9 (9) job skills training activities directly 10 related to employment; 11 education directly related to employment (10)12 for a participant who has not received a high school diploma 13 or a certificate of high school equivalency; 14 (11)satisfactory attendance at a secondary school or course of study leading to a certificate of general 15 16 equivalency in the case of a participant who has not completed 17 secondary school or received such a certificate; and 18 the provision of child-care services to (12)19 a participant who is participating in a community service 20 program. 21 **B**. The department shall recognize community 22 service programs and job training programs that are operated 23 by an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo. 24 C. 2 D. The department shall require a parent, caretaker or other adult who is a member of a benefit group to 3 4 engage in a work activity once the department determines he is 5 ready to engage in a work activity or once he has received cash assistance or services for twenty-four months or as 6 7 otherwise required by the federal act, whether or not 8 consecutive, whichever is earlier. The department shall 9 determine that a parent, caretaker or other adult who is a 10 member of a benefit group is ready to engage in a work activity by conducting an individualized assessment of him. 11 12 The department shall not impose a uniform time period for all 13 parents, caretakers or other adults who are members of a 14 benefit group to engage in a work activity. The following qualify as temporary alternative 15 Ε. 16 work activities that the department may establish for no longer than twelve weeks except as otherwise provided: 17 18 participating in parenting classes, money (1) 19 management classes or life skills training; 20 participating in a certified alcohol or (2)drug addiction program; 21 22 (3) in the case of a homeless benefit group, 23 finding a home; 24 (4) in the case of a participant who is a 25 victim of domestic violence residing in a domestic violence . 124752. 2

 weeks; and

5 (5) in the case of a participant who does not
6 speak English, participating in a course in English as a
7 second language.

8 F. Subject to the availability of funds, the
9 department in cooperation with the labor department, New
10 Mexico office of Indian affairs and other appropriate state
11 agencies may develop projects to provide for the placement of
12 participants in work activities, including the following:

(1) participating in unpaid internships with private and government entities;

(2) refurbishing publicly assisted housing;

(3) volunteering at a head start program or a

school;

(4) weatherizing low-income housing; and

(5) restoring public sites and buildings, including monuments, parks, fire stations, police buildings, jails, libraries, museums, auditoriums, convention halls, hospitals, buildings for administrative offices and city halls.

G. If a participant is engaged in full-time postsecondary education studies or an activity set out in

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Paragraphs (9) through (11) of Subsection A of this section, the participant shall engage in another work activity at the same time. Additionally, for two-parent families that receive federally funded child-care assistance, the participant's spouse shall engage in a work activity set out in Paragraphs (1) through (5) or (7) of Subsection A of this section unless the participant suffers from a temporary or complete disability that bars him from engaging in a work activity or he is barred from engaging in a work activity because he provides sole care for a disabled person.

H. A participant engaged in post-secondary education studies shall make reasonable efforts to obtain a loan, scholarship, grant or other assistance to pay for costs and tuition and the department shall disregard those amounts in the eligibility determination.

I. For as long as the described conditions exist, the following are exempt from the work requirement:

(1) a participant barred from engaging in a work activity because he is temporarily or completely disabled;

(2) a participant over age sixty;

(3) a participant barred from engaging in awork activity because he provides the sole care for a disabledperson;

(4) a single custodial parent caring for a

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1 child less than twelve months old for a lifetime total of 2 twelve months: a single custodial parent caring for a 3 (5) child under six years of age if the parent is unable to obtain 4 child care for one or more of the following reasons: 5 unavailability of appropriate child 6 (a) 7 care within a reasonable distance from the parent's home or work as defined by the children, youth and families 8 9 department; 10 (b) unavailability or unsuitability of 11 informal child care by a relative under other arrangements as 12 defined by the children, youth and families department; or 13 (c) unavailability of appropriate and 14 affordable formal child-care arrangements as defined by the children, youth and families department; 15 16 (6) a pregnant woman during her last trimester of pregnancy; 17 18 a participant prevented from working by a (7) 19 temporary emergency or a situation that precludes work 20 participation for thirty days or less; 21 (8) a participant who demonstrates by 22 reliable medical, psychological or mental reports, court 23 orders or police reports that family violence or threat of 24 family violence effectively bars the participant from 25 employment; and . 124752. 2 - 6 -
