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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:			
16	Section 1. Section 22-10-3.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1997,			
17	Chapter 238, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:			
18	"22-10-3.3. BACKGROUND CHECKS			
19	A. An applicant for initial certification shall be			
20	fingerprinted and shall provide two fingerprint cards or the			
21	equivalent electronic fingerprints to the department of			
22	education to obtain the applicant's federal bureau of			
23	investigation record. Convictions of felonies or misdemeanors			
24	contained in the federal bureau of investigation record shall			
25	be used in accordance with the Criminal Offender Employment			
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Act. Other information contained in the federal bureau of investigation record, if supported by independent evidence, may form the basis for the denial, suspension or revocation of a certificate for good and just cause. Records and any related information shall be privileged and shall not be disclosed to a person not directly involved in the certification or employment decisions affecting the specific applicant. The applicant for initial certification shall pay for the cost of obtaining the federal bureau of investigation record.

B. Local school boards shall develop policies and procedures to require background checks on an applicant who has been offered employment, a contractor, or a contractor's employee with unsupervised access to students. An applicant for employment who has been initially certified within twelve months of applying for employment with a local school board shall not be required to submit to another background check if the department of education has copies of his federal bureau of investigation records on file. An applicant who has been offered employment, a contractor, or a contractor's employee with unsupervised access to students shall provide two fingerprint cards or the equivalent electronic fingerprints to the local school board to obtain his federal bureau of investigation record. The applicant who has been offered employment, contractor or contractor's employee may be

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1 required to pay for the cost of obtaining a background check. C. Local school boards may develop policies and 2 procedures to require background checks on volunteers with 3 4 unsupervised access to students. If the local school board develops policies and procedures requiring background checks 5 on volunteers, the volunteer shall provide two fingerprint 6 7 cards or the equivalent electronic fingerprints to the local school board to obtain the volunteer's federal bureau of 8 9 investigation record. Background checks on volunteers with 10 unsupervised access to students shall be conducted at the expense of the local school district or through cooperative 11 12 agreements with law enforcement.

At the request of a local school board, the D. department of education is authorized to release copies of federal bureau of investigation records that are on file with the department of education and that are not more than twelve months old. Convictions of felonies or misdemeanors contained in the federal bureau of investigation record shall be used in accordance with the Criminal Offender Employment Act; provided that other information contained in the federal bureau of investigation record, if supported by independent evidence, may form the basis for the employment decisions for good and Records and any related information shall be just cause. privileged and shall not be disclosed to a person not directly involved in the [employment] decision affecting the specific
