 - Section 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION--TRANSFERS. --
- A. On July 1, 2000, all money, appropriations, . 127663.1

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records, furniture, equipment and other property of the New Mexico health policy commission shall be transferred to the department of health.

- B. On July 1, 2000, all contracts in effect for the New Mexico health policy commission shall be binding on the department of health.
- C. On July 1, 2000, all references in law to the New Mexico health policy commission shall be construed as references to the department of health.
- Section 3. REPEAL. -- Section 9-7-11.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, Chapter 139, Section 2, as amended) is repealed.
- Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2000.

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
