RELATING TO TAXATION; AMENDING A SECTION OF THE NMSA 1978
PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTIONS OF CIGARETTE TAXES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 7-1-6.11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983, Chapter 211, Section 16, as amended) is amended to read:

"7-1-6.11. DISTRIBUTIONS OF CIGARETTE TAXES. --

A. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the county and municipality recreational fund in an amount equal to four and three-quarters percent of the net receipts, exclusive of penalties and interest, attributable to the cigarette tax.

B. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the county and municipal cigarette tax fund in an amount equal to nine and one-half percent of the .127655.1

net receipts, exclusive of penalties and interest, attributable to the cigarette tax.

- C. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the cancer center at the university of New Mexico school of medicine in an amount equal to four and three-quarters percent of the net receipts, exclusive of penalties and interest, attributable to the cigarette tax.
- D. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the New Mexico finance authority in an amount equal to seven and one-eighth percent of the net receipts, exclusive of penalties and interest, attributable to the cigarette tax. Beginning in the month following the month that the New Mexico finance authority certifies that all obligations for the bonds issued pursuant to Laws 1993, Chapter 358, Section 4 have been fully discharged, the distribution in this subsection to the New Mexico finance authority shall cease and a distribution in the same amount shall be made to the university of New Mexico school of medicine medical trust fund."

B. A distribution pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to the energy, minerals and natural resources department in an amount equal to twenty-five percent of the net receipts attributable to the governmental gross receipts tax. Forty percent of the distribution is appropriated to the energy, minerals and natural resources department to implement the provisions of the New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act, and sixty percent of the distribution is appropriated to the energy, minerals and natural resources department for state park and recreation area capital improvements, including the costs of planning, engineering, design, construction, renovation, repair, equipment and furnishings.

C. The state pledges to and agrees with the holders of any bonds or notes issued by the New Mexico finance authority or by the energy, minerals and natural resources department and payable from the net receipts attributable to the governmental gross receipts tax distributed to the New Mexico finance authority or the energy, minerals and natural resources department pursuant to this section that the state will not limit, reduce or alter the distribution of the net receipts attributable to the governmental gross receipts tax to the New Mexico finance authority or the energy, minerals and natural resources department or limit, reduce or alter the rate of \$50623F\$1
