15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 9-5B-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992,
17	Chapter 91, Section 1) is amended to read:
18	"9-5B-1. SHORT TITLE[This act] <u>Chapter 9, Article 5B</u>
19	<u>NMSA 1978</u> may be cited as the "New Mexico Youth Conservation
20	Corps Act"."
21	Section 2. Section 9-5B-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992,
22	Chapter 91, Section 3) is amended to read:
23	"9-5B-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the New Mexico Youth
24	Conservation Corps Act:
25	A. "commission" means the New Mexico youth
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conservation corps commission;

"corps" means the New Mexico youth conservation 2 **B**. 3 corps;

C. "corps member" means a person enrolled in the 4 5 corps;

[D. "department" means the energy, minerals and 6 7 natural resources department;

E] D. "nonprofit organization" means any organization that has been granted an exemption from federal income tax by the United States commissioner of internal revenue as an organization described in Section 501(c) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended or renumbered:

> **E**. "office" means the state land office;

F. "project" means an activity that can be completed in six months or less, results in a specific identifiable service or product that otherwise would not be accomplished with existing funds and does not duplicate the routine services or functions of the sponsor;

"resident" means an individual who has resided G. in New Mexico for at least six months before applying for employment with the corps; and

"sponsor" means any local unit of government, H. state agency, federal agency, nonprofit organization or federally recognized Native American tribe."

2	Chapter 91, Section 5) is amended to read:
3	"9-5B-5. COMMISSION CREATEDMEMBERSHIPAPPOINTMENTS
4	TERMS VACANCI ES COMPENSATI ON
5	A. There is created a nine-member "New Mexico
6	youth conservation corps commission", which is
7	administratively attached to the [department] <u>office</u> . The
8	commission consists of the following members:
9	(1) the superintendent of public instruction
10	or his designee;
11	(2) the commissioner of public lands or his
12	designee;
13	[(3) the secretary of energy, minerals and
14	natural resources or his designee]
15	(3) the director of the state parks division
16	<u>or his designee;</u>
17	(4) the secretary of [the youth authority]
18	children, youth and families or his designee; and
19	(5) five members of the general public
20	appointed by the governor to reflect the geographic diversity
21	of the state, one of whom is knowledgeable in the current
22	policies of the United States forest service and one of whom
23	is Native American.
24	B. One [of the members] <u>public member</u> of the
25	commission shall be appointed by the governor for a one-year
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term, two <u>public</u> members shall be appointed for two-year terms and two public members shall be appointed for three-year terms All subsequent appointments of public members shall be [and]. made for three-year terms.

The public members shall serve at the pleasure Vacancies on the commission caused by the of the governor. loss of a public member shall be filled by appointment by the 8 governor for the unexpired term within sixty days of the vacancy. Public commission members shall serve until their successors have been appointed.

A majority of the members of the commission D. constitutes a quorum for transaction of business. The commission shall elect a chairman from its membership.

Е. Members of the commission shall be compensated as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."

Section 4. Section 9-5B-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992, Chapter 91, Section 6) is amended to read:

> "9-5B-6. COMMISSION -- POWERS AND DUTIES. --

> > A. The commission may:

(1) accept gifts, devises, grants and donations from others to carry out the provisions of the New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act;

request assistance and staff support from (2)the [department] office;

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1	(3) employ such personnel as necessary to
2	carry out the provisions of the New Mexico Youth Conservation
3	Corps Act;
4	(4) delegate responsibility for the
5	administration and implementation of conservation projects,
6	corps members' employment and supervision, project
7	coordination and other program matters;
8	(5) establish work camps and long-term
9	residential facilities to house corps members and their

11	(6) contact potential sponsors and funding
12	sources for support.
13	B. The commission shall:
14	(1) adopt rules [and regulations] that are
15	necessary for the proper administration of the New Mexico

19	regulations] adopted pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this

21	(3) develop and approve corps work projects,
22	activities and contracts with project sponsors;
23	(4) establish standards, procedures and
24	policies for selecting, hiring, providing compensation for and
25	other personnel matters involving corps members and other

FUND CREATED- - DI SPOSI TI ON. - -11 The "New Mexico youth conservation corps fund" A. 12 is created in the state treasury. All appropriations, gifts, 13 devises, grants and donations received shall be deposited in 14 the fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the commission for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the New 15 Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act. Any interest accruing to 16 17 the fund shall remain in the fund. Money in the fund shall 18 not revert at the end of a fiscal year. 19 **B**. 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1	Section 6. TEMPORARY PROVISIONTRANSFER OF PROPERTY AND
2	CONTRACTSOn July 1, 1999, all money, appropriations,
3	records, equipment, furnishings and other property held by the
4	energy, minerals and natural resources department for the
5	benefit of the New Mexico youth conservation corps or the New
6	Mexico youth conservation corps commission shall be
7	transferred to the state land office. All existing contracts
8	and other obligations that the energy, minerals and natural
9	resources department entered into for the New Mexico youth
10	conservation corps or the New Mexico youth conservation corps
11	commission shall be binding on the state land office.
12	Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
