15	WHEREAS, obesity is the second leading cause of					
16	preventable death in the country, responsible for three					
17	hundred thousand lives lost each year; and					
18	WHEREAS, health care costs directly attributable to					
19	obesity are approximately seventy billion dollars					
20	(\$70, 000, 000); and					
21	WHEREAS, obesity is a major contributor to a wide variety					
22	of chronic and debilitating diseases, including diabetes, high					
23	blood pressure, heart disease, joint and back problems,					
24	hypertension, gall bladder disease, respiratory dysfunction,					
25	gout and osteoarthritis; and					
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WHEREAS, approximately fifty percent of breast cancer and forty-two percent of colon cancer cases are found among obese individuals; and

WHEREAS, is it estimated that thirty-five percent of our population is obese and the prevalence of obesity grew a shocking thirty-four percent during the past ten years; and

WHEREAS, a New Mexico diabetes control program study found that there are approximately twenty thousand obese children between the ages of eleven and fifteen; and

WHEREAS, the percentage of Hispanic children determined by this study to suffer from obesity is nearly fifty-eight percent, compared to an overall Hispanic population of thirtyseven and one-half percent, and the percentage of Native American children with obesity is more than fifteen percent, compared to an overall Native American population of approximately nine percent; and

WHEREAS, a national study by Kaiser Permanente indicated that there is a significant potential for a reduction in health care expenditures through obesity prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, affluence and the effects of the computer age have considerable reduced the level of our society's physical activity, especially among school-age and pre-school-age children; and

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for state health . 126962.1

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agencies, including school health officials, and New Mexico health professionals to place obesity awareness in the forefront of health education efforts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health and the state department of public education make substantially increased efforts to educate the public, especially school-age children, of the most effective ways of avoiding or treating obesity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that departmental efforts include improved education of health professionals, school health officials, school cafeteria nutritionists and managers, hospital and other health facility nutritionists; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that statewide organizations of health professionals be requested to contribute to obesity education of their respective professions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the school of medicine at the university of New Mexico give serious consideration to expanding its course work in basic nutrition education so as to favorably impact the obesity problem facing New Mexicans; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health, the state department of education and the university of New Mexico school of medicine report their respective efforts in relation to obesity education efforts to the legislative health and

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		1	human services committee by October 1, 1999; and

		3	sent to the secretary of health, the superintendent of public
		4	education, the dean of the school of medicine at the
