## A MEMORI AL

REQUESTI NG THE CONTI NUED COOPERATI ON OF THE STATE HI GHMAY AND TRANSPORTATI ON DEPARTMENT I N THE PLANNI NG AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE LAS CRUCES BYPASS.

WHEREAS, Las Cruces has experi enced a tremendous amount of growth over the past years, with the city's popul ation growing during the 1980s at a rate of thirty-seven and ei ghttenths percent, fromforty-five thousand ei ghty-six to sixtytwo thousand one hundred twent y-six, and Dona Ana county has grown at an even faster rate of forty and six-tenths percent, from ni nety-six thousand three hundred forty to one hundred thirty-five thousand five hundred ten; and

WHEREAS, si nce 1990, the popul ati on has conti nued to increase at a substantial rate of more than twenty percent; and

WHEREAS, this expl osive grouth has had a maj or i mpact on local facilities, incl uding the overall transportation system, and alternate rel iever routes and capacity enhancements for various thoroughf ares have been anal yzed, incl uding i mprovements to United St ates hi ghway 70; and

WHEREAS, United States hi ghway 70 serves as the princi pal arterial east from Las Cruces to White Sands missile range, Al amogordo and Rui doso and west to interstate 10 for access to Deming, Lordsburg and Tucson; and

WHEREAS, popul ation grouth experi enced within the area has had a direct correl ation with the level of traffic, with currently twenty-ni ne thousand seven hundred thirty-five vehi cles per day travel ing al ong the western segment of the hi ghway, an increase of ten thousand vehicl es per day within the interstate 25 - United States hi ghway 70 interchange area; and

WHEREAS, the Las Cruces metropolitan planning organi zation recei ved assi stance fromthe state legislature to contract for consultant services to determine alternate rel i ever routes and capacity enhancements for United States hi ghway 70; and

WHEREAS, the study determined that the primary emphasis for transportation improvements should be to expand the capacity of the exi sting United States hi ghway 70 funding for the United States hi ghway 70 frontage roads and rel ated . 126380. 1
i mprovements whi ch have been allocated at a level of ni netyt wo million dollars $(\$ 92,000,000)$ in state and federal money; and

WHEREAS, the continuing growth of the area prevents the i mprovements to United States hi ghway 70 from being a per manent fix; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexi co state I and office has in excess of ten thousand acres of I and south of United States hi ghway 70 and east of interstate 25 in Las Cruces that are primed for future urban devel opment and, with private land in the area, this undevel oped I and provi des si gni ficant opportunity for early pl anning to meet the continuing growth of southern New Mexi co; and

WHEREAS, the city of Las Cruces has worked with the United States bureau of I and management and the state I and office in an effort to begin the process of setting aside corridors for devel opment of future arterials and a bypass that would connect United States hi ghway 70 froma poi nt near Organ to interstate 10 south of the interstates 25 and 10 i nterchange, and approxi matel y two miles of the estimated si xteen and one-half miles of this route have been set aside; and

WHEREAS, the city conti nues to work with the bureau of I and management and the state land office in an effort to firm up the final route al ignment and establish a dedi cated right . 126380. 1
of way for the souther $n$ bypass from United St ates hi ghway 70 to interstate 10; and

WHEREAS, through continued planning and early right-of-way acqui sition, Las Cruces, Dona Ana county and the state will be able to provide a Iogi cal continuation of the overal transportation network in southern New Mexico at the lowest possi ble cost;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATI VES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO that the state hi ghway and transportation department, the state I and office, the United States bureau of I and management, the city of Las Cruces and Dona Ana county be requested to continue thei $r$ cooperation and devel opment of a Las Cruces bypass; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copi es of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of hi ghway and transportation, the commissioner of publ ic lands, the state director of the bureau of I and management, the mayor of Las Cruces and the Dona Ana board of county commi ssi oners.
