**REQUESTING THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION STUDY
THE FEASIBILITY OF INCORPORATING SERVICE LEARNING INTO THE
REGULAR CURRICULUM AND ENCOURAGE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO RECOGNIZE

community service programs and meets the needs of communities;

people to serve their communities while enhancing their
education; and**

**WHEREAS, service learning can be done by a student of any
age and ability in any district in New Mexico and projects can**

9 to today's world and provides students with projects that
10 enhance critical thinking and problem solving skills; and

11 WHEREAS, research has shown that schools that provide
12 service learning opportunities have reduced dropout rates and
13 enhanced academic achievement; and

14 WHEREAS, service learning supports the state board of
15 education's content standards and benchmarks;

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
17 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state department of public
18 education examine the feasibility of incorporating service
19 learning into the regular curriculum and encourage school
20 districts to record on students' transcripts or high school
21 graduation diplomas their participation in community-based or
22 service learning; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state department of
24 public education report its findings and recommendations to
25 the legislative education study committee no later than

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October 29, 1999; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the director of the legislative education study committee and the superintendent of public instruction for appropriate distribution.
