
#### **√** Owned

  - Provides the most comprehensive data available for all state-owned facilities focus is on insurable value
- PCD tracks building information on properties in their jurisdiction
  - New FacilityMax database is operational
  - Liaising with Risk Management on data
  - Issues to work out on building and site IDs

#### ✓ Leased

- PCD tracks leases for all Executive agencies
  - Except SLO and institutions of higher learning
- Risk Management also has data on leased facilities (incomplete)
- ✓ Space provided by Counties for State Use (district courts, DAs, PHOs)
  - Nobody currently tracks
  - ARC has developed a snap shot inventory



# **Barriers / Preliminary Recommendations**

#### ✓ Owned and leased facilities

- No unified source of data for all state facilities
- Currently no unified coding system
  - No common building IDs (different numbering systems, and possibly names)
    - No common site IDs
    - Different definition of what constitutes a building
    - Different information on building occupant (who pays insurance vs. occupying agency)
  - Risk Management and PCD are discussing this issue

#### May be data discrepancies

- What is owned, leased
- Names
- Sizes



- √ Staffing
  - No source of data exists of staffing at each site
- √ Limited agency long-range capital planning
- **✓** County-provided facilities
  - No one is responsible for tracking county-provided space
  - No space standards for county-provided facilities
    - Can result in space inequities, space issues that can impact services
  - Counties may have limited resources to provide facilities
    - May sometimes results in state agencies leasing space
- ✓ Privatized facilities (e.g., prisons, Long-term care facilities) are not tracked anywhere

### ✓ Properties (land)

- No comprehensive database on state-owned property (land)
  - State Land Office maintains a comprehensive database of its holdings, but does not track land held by other executive agencies, legislative, and judicial branches
  - GSD PCD maintains records (deeds, plats) of properties under their jurisdiction – but there are gaps and no comprehensive database
- No comprehensive system to track water rights on state lands (non SLO)

- ✓ No comprehensive policies for acquisition and disposal of state-owned properties
  - ▶ CBPC has directed staff to establish these policies
  - SB 220 lays groundwork to give CBPC authority for developing acquisition and disposal strategies
  - Policies should cover acquisition by gifting or MOUs

#### **SB 220 – Section 1 B**

- (2) review proposed lease-purchase agreements pursuant to Section 15-10-2 NMSA 1978;
- (3) work with the general services department and other state agencies in developing recommendations for addressing deferred maintenance on state facilities and disposal strategies for aging facilities no longer able to serve their mission; and
- (4) utilizing life cycle costing, work with the general services department in developing recommendations regarding whether the state should lease, lease-purchase or purchase needed additional facilities.



# **Preliminary Recommendations**

- ✓ Create consistent and comprehensive database of state assets (facilities and non SLO lands), and leased properties
  - Assign a single agency / entity to compile, consolidate, and update data
    - Report annually to the CBPC
    - Make data available on-line to CBPC members and staff for analysis and review
  - Resolve discrepancies from various data sources
  - Expand PCD's FacilityMax to include consistent data for all state assets and leased properties including as a minimum:
    - <u>Location</u> (Develop a common asset identifier for owned buildings and sites)
    - Agency Owner
    - <u>Size</u> (GSF, NSF, acres of land)
    - <u>Condition</u> (owned)
    - Occupants (owned and leased, number of personnel by location)
    - <u>Replacement Value</u> (owned and leased)
    - Water rights (owned property)



### **Preliminary Recommendations**

- √ Require state agencies to develop long-range capital master plans
  - Establish guidance for plan development
- ✓ Establish policies for acquiring and disposing state assets that includes an analysis of costs and benefits considering
  - Compliance with the Capitol Buildings Master Plan
  - Potential long-term uses and mission requirements
  - Total costs of ownership and operation
- ✓ Develop space standards for state functions provided by counties
  - District Courts
  - District Attorneys
  - Public Health Offices
