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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
21	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
22	"Organic Production Act".
23	SECTION 2. NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
24	POWERS
25	A. The Organic Production Act shall be administered

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1 and enforced by the New Mexico department of agriculture, under 2 the direction of the board of regents of New Mexico state 3 university. The New Mexico department of agriculture is authorized to regulate the production, handling and 4 5 certification of organic agricultural products pursuant to rules adopted by the board of regents of New Mexico state 6 7 university. In promulgating the rules, the board shall consider the requirements of the federal Organic Foods 8 9 Production Act of 1990 and the national organic program rules. The department may: 10 Β. charge fees and assessments to fund its (1)11 12 organic certification program; and implement education and marketing programs (2)13 14 to assist organic producers and handlers and those considering certification as organic producers or handlers. 15 SECTION 3. FEES AND ASSESSMENTS.--16 Pursuant to rules adopted by the board of 17 Α. regents of New Mexico state university, the New Mexico 18 19 department of agriculture may impose and collect fees for 20 certification and registration as follows: producers and handlers shall pay a fee not 21 (1)to exceed three hundred fifty dollars (\$350) for a new 22 application and a fee not to exceed three hundred dollars 23 (\$300) for annual renewal applications; and 24 producers and handlers may be subject to 25 (2) .183200.4 - 2 -

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late fees not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).

2 Β. Pursuant to rules adopted by the board of 3 regents of New Mexico state university, the New Mexico department of agriculture may impose and collect assessments for the basic certification process of certified organic producers and handlers at an annual rate not to exceed one percent of the total gross sales of the organically produced agricultural products based on the previous year's sales. 8

9 C. The New Mexico department of agriculture shall provide a payment schedule for all assessments due to the 10 11 department.

D. The board of regents of New Mexico state university may authorize an organic production inspector to charge reasonable fees not to exceed the actual costs of performing additional inspections due to noncompliance or at the request of a producer or handler.

SECTION 4. DISPOSITION OF FUNDS. -- All money received by the New Mexico department of agriculture pursuant to the provisions of the Organic Production Act, including assessments, fees, appropriations, gifts, grants and donations, shall be expended only for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of that act.

SECTION 5. APPLICABILITY TO OTHER LAWS.--

Any transactions involving agricultural products Α. that bear labels stating that the agricultural products are .183200.4

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organically produced are subject to Sections 57-15-1 through
 57-15-10 NMSA 1978.

B. Any transactions involving agricultural products
that are food and that bear labels stating that the
agricultural products are organically produced are subject to
the New Mexico Food Act.

SECTION 6. TEMPORARY PROVISIONS--TRANSFERS.--

A. On July 1, 2011, all functions, appropriations, money, records, furniture, equipment and other property of the organic commodity commission are transferred to the New Mexico department of agriculture.

B. On July 1, 2011, all contractual obligations of the organic commodity commission are binding on the New Mexico department of agriculture.

C. On July 1, 2011, all money in the organic market development fund shall be transferred to the New Mexico department of agriculture.

D. On July 1, 2011, all references in the law or rule to the organic commodity commission are deemed to be references to the New Mexico department of agriculture.

E. The rules of the organic commodity commission are deemed to be the rules of the board of regents of New Mexico state university for the New Mexico department of agriculture until amended or repealed by the board of regents of New Mexico state university.
